**MARCH 14 – NATURAL DISASTER PLANNING**

How do you protect your building from the ravages of a fire, flood, tornado, or a hurricane? As a part of their annual spring break Galveston field study, the Ball State University Historic Preservation graduate students will present their findings on how to best protect historic commercial, residential, and institutional properties.

**MARCH 21 – WHAT IS “HISTORIC”?**

This practical session will present the facts about the various levels of historic designations available at the national, state, and local levels. Some of the basics discussed will be what qualifies a property or site as historic, how do you apply for recognition, and what are the benefits that come with a historic designation.

**MARCH 28 – SAVING ENERGY IN YOUR HISTORIC BUILDING**

Representatives from Standard Renewable Energy will provide tips and techniques on lowering utility bills in historic buildings. SRE is also a local leader in green, environmentally friendly retrofitting so you can learn how to help the Earth and your check book.

**APRIL 4 – ART DECO ON THE TEXAS GULF COAST**

David Bush and Jim Parsons of the Greater Houston Preservation Alliance will present a lecture on Art Deco style architecture. Their lecture is in conjunction with their book “Houston Deco: Modernistic Architecture of the Texas Coast.” They will discuss the style overall and gear their presentation to both Houston and Galveston. Books will be for sale at the event and a book signing is to be held afterwards.

**APRIL 25 – CONSERVATION OF HISTORIC BOOKS, PAPERS AND PHOTOGRAPHS**

This practical session will provide information on the storage and display of family documents, photographs and artifacts. We will discuss what makes documents deteriorate and ways of slowing down the process. We will also discuss the advantages of having photographs restored or digitized. Attendees are encouraged to bring historic photos to the class.
